HAYDON, Patrick priest
Father Haydon was a much loved priest who
ministered to people of the Catholic Faith in
Canberra. Father Alexander J McGilvray in his book
The Hallowed High Adventure worked with the then
Monsignor Patrick Haydon, Canberra's first parish
priest between February 1942 to the end of 1946. He
writes in his book about Father Haydon. *Shortly after
his ordination in 1912 Father Haydon was appointed
assistant priest at Queanbeyan...Father Haydon
commenced his schooling with the Sisters of St Joseph
at Granville in Sydney and did his secondary studies
at St Joseph's College Hunters Hill. Eventually he
entered St Patrick's College Manly to study for the
Priesthood...In 1928 Father Haydon became
Canberra's first Catholic Parish Priest. For over
twenty one years he was to guide the destiny of the
Catholic Community, and he became as much a part
of Australia's Capital as any man...Mr Kevin J Wade,
a very special friend of Monsignor Haydon since
1927, has assisted the author of these pages with
copious notes and jottings. In his recollections of 19th
April 1949, he wrote, "As a reward for their
prolonged kindnesses to him, Monsignor Haydon
called upon the Corkhills of Riverview on Easter
Sunday afternoon, 17th April, although he appeared
far from well. That morning, he had made a brief visit
to Messrs AT and JC Shakespeare of the Canberra
Times to thank them for the many favours in their
paper. That evening I dined with him at his table. It
was obvious that the good priest was ill, this was
evident on Good Friday when he conducted the
Stations of the Cross at St Christopher's with his
customary fervour and devotion. Father Clarrie
Lehane who had been Monsignor's Confessor for
years, arrived at the Presbytery on Tuesday morning,
19th April, as they were preparing to take the Pastor
to hospital...The Last Sacraments were administered
by Father SK Wellington and shortly before mid night*

on Tuesday 19th April, the end came peacefully...
Thousands attended his funeral and he was buried on
21st April in Woden Cemetery.
