May Kappler was buried at Woden Cemetery on 28th April 1957. Roy was buried in the next grave at Woden. No dates known in cemetery records. The Woden Burial Register states that Roy George Arthur Kappler died on 6th April 1963 aged 79 years. His address was given as 17 Ducane Street Forrest. May Elizabeth Kappler died on 26th April 1957 aged 73 years. Her grave was paid by Roy George Arthur Kappler of 17 Ducane Street Forrest.

O'SULLIVAN, Mary & John hd & ps
John Aloysius O'Sullivan was buried on 3rd August 1959 at Woden Cemetery. In the next grave Mary Agnes O'Sullivan was buried. Dates not recorded in cemetery records. Both were active members of the Roman Catholic Church. Father McGilvray in his book *The Hallowed High Adventure* mentions Jack O'Sullivan. *At the Acton Hall in November 1922, he [Father Haydon] held the inaugural meeting of Canberra's first Catholic Club and explained its purposes to a large gathering of men. "You have assembled to establish a group of interested young Catholic laymen who intend to band together for the religious, social and intellectual welfare of its members." Mr Jack O'Sullivan read a paper formulating the intended scope of the proposed Club. Jack O'Sullivan had been chosen because of his previous wide experience as a member of the executive of the Catholic Young Men's Society of Victoria, which had over the years moulded Catholic laymen of outstanding caliber in the southern state. Speeches were delivered also by John Brophy, Professor Gilchrist of Duntroon Military College, JJ Dillon, SH Slatter, J Esmond, and Messrs Thompson and Boland. The first president of the new organisation was Father Haydon, with Mr JA O'Sullivan as vice-president, and Jerry Dillon who played a very impressive part in Canberra's Catholic activities in those days was elected secretary. Amongst the executive committee are the names of men who were to be prominent in the Catholic scene for decades more: J Brophy (Acton), OJ Collidge, Geo O'Neill, P Pola (Duntroon), J Ryan (Mugga), and Mr J Esmond of Eastlake...*

Charles Francis was controller of stores and one of the men responsible for the founding of the Australian Natives Association in the FCT and the Canberra Bowling Club (Hotel Canberra and later at Forrest). His daughter, Lorna Marriott wrote a brief outline of his life. *Charles Francis was born in Malmsbury, Victoria in 1878 and died in Canberra November 1942. He entered the Commonwealth Service about 1913. He was stationed at Jervis Bay during the building of the Naval Station. He first came to Canberra in 1915 when he was associated with preliminary works connected with the foundation of the Capital.*

Living in the Capital during its most important and formative years Mr Francis played no small part in public affairs. In the early years he was prominently identified with the Federal Capital Representation League which was formed in October, 1927, with the aim of gaining Parliamentary representation for the Territory as well as representation on the Federal Capital Commission. A petition was subsequently presented by Dr LW Nott resulting in the addition of one member to the Commission. Mr Francis continued as President of the League for some time.

He was a foundation member of the Canberra Bowling Club. He was a lover of Canberra for the sake of its beautiful layout. He was also an ardent believer that the National Capital of Australia had a great destiny. He identified himself with many movements in the National Capital and gave freely of his energy and enthusiasm.

He was associated with Canberra for many years before he came to live in Canberra in November, 1923 and was one of the first residents of Forrest, Blandfordia as it was then known. [The Francis family lived in 65 Franklin Street.]

Albert Edward Jackson was buried in the ex-servicemen's section of Woden Cemetery on 26th July, 1955. He died on 27th July aged 56 and at the time his address was 35 Telopea Park Barton. His grave was paid by the RSS&AILA.

Leslie Marriott died in 1937. An Obituary appeared in the *Handbook of the Federal Capital Territory Lawn Tennis Association*, 1937. It is as follows: *By the death of Mr Leslie Marriott, the Tennis Association and the tennis community of Canberra have lost an honoured servant and a faithful friend. The late Mr Marriott identified himself with tennis early in 1923, and during the succeeding thirteen years his interest and enthusiasm continued to grow. Untiring efforts and indefatigable energy were displayed on all matters affecting the Association, and with a sound knowledge on matters of constitution, in addition to his ability, logic and fairness, he justly earned the esteem and friendship of all with whom he came in contact. He held stoutly to what he believed to be right, and firmly defended on matters of principle but, in all rulings of a majority he readily acquiesced. The late Mr Marriott was one of the first residents of Forrest, then known as Blandfordia, and he took a prominent part in the formation and administration of that Club, serving in various capacities, including that of secretary. Elected as a delegate to the Association, his outstanding ability soon resulted in his election as vice-president*

and later as president. In this position he served for three years. During this period vital alterations were made to the constitution and his sound knowledge on such matters assisted largely in the framing of that which now governs the Association and which has since stood the test of time. He was vice-president for the period 1927-1929, president for 1929-1932 but, in 1932 he refused nomination for the position of president, but accepted the more onerous office of secretary. In this capacity he served the Association faithfully and ably until his death in 1937. The loss sustained by the Association, is, indeed very great, but the standard of service set by him should serve as an inspiration to those he left to carry on his task. Leslie Marriott was buried in Woden Cemetery in the Anglican Section on 7.1.1937. A number of people with the name of Marriott are buried in Woden Cemetery. They are, Helen Elizabeth who died 28th July, 1977, Joan buried 15th September 1958 and Kenneth George who died on 23rd February, 1987 (buried Gungahlin).
