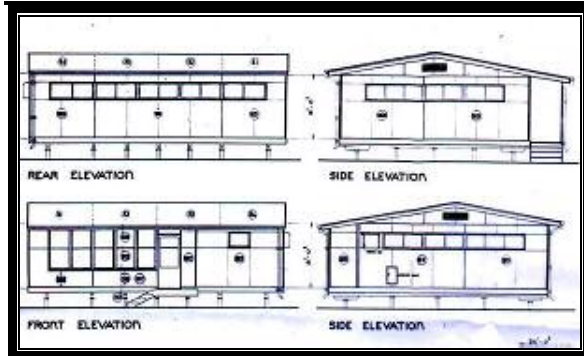

PINI, Guiditta, Bruno, Giovanni & Guido hd farmer, ganger & carpenter Giovanni Pini was another early Italian man to come to Canberra in the mid 1920s. He first worked as a plasterer and labourer on the main sewerage line. He also sold fruit door to door and later opened a greengrocer business in Manuka but it was not successful. The family sold the shop in 1929 and started an orchard and poultry business. (Reference *Canberra Historical Journal* 24<sup>th</sup> September 1989 – Article by Barry York *The early Italians in Canberra 1924 to the 1950s.*) John Pini of Jerrabomberra Avenue paid for the grave in the RC section of Woden Cemetery for Tomaso Tempio who lived at Causeway who died on 8<sup>th</sup> June 1942 aged 61 years. Bruno Pini of 62 Stuart Street Narrabundah paid for the grave in the RC section of Woden Cemetery for Tennence John Pini of the same address who died on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1961 aged one month.

RUSSELL, Kathleen & Charles hd & grazier Charles Croft Russell was the son of William Octavius Russell who was the man responsible between 1917 and 1920/21 listing all the accommodation in the Federal Capital

Territory - including name of owner and materials used.

WO Russell's records the information that the majority of married couples between 1913 and 1920 lived in humpies constructed from hessian walls and galvanised iron roofs. Charles Croft Russell for his 90th birthday on 6th February, 1995 had a short family history written part of which reads as follows:

*My Father. William Octavius Russell, "WO" was born on 10th October, 1860 at Mulgoa near Sydney, the eighth son and eleventh child of Captain William Russell, later of the 28th Royal Gloucestershire Regiment and Jane Rebecca Jamieson. Jane was the daughter of Sir John Jamieson of Regentville, a naval surgeon, MP, large landholder, first President of the Agricultural Society and founder of the Sydney Turf Club. He in turn was the son of Thomas Jamieson, surgeon on the Flagship of the First Fleet (Sirius) and later Surgeon General of NSW... My father was educated at Fort Street High School whilst living with his aunt Rebecca Chepnell at Hunters Hill. Upon leaving school he joined the NSW Lands Department and in 1884 enlisted in the Australian contingent that served in the Sudan War... WO Russell worked in Hay, Bega, Cooma and later in Queanbeyan where he was Clerk of Petty Sessions. Whilst in Cooma he married Rebecca, eldest daughter of Charles Solomon, founder of Solomon's Store in Cooma and the town's first Mayor... He worked in Queanbeyan from the turn of the century until transferred to Canberra in 1913 where he took up the position of Chief Clerk of the Lands Department...*

Charles Croft Russell was born in Cooma in 1905. Charles was a member of the First Scout Group founded by his father in 1915 and represented them at General Bridges Grave. Charles also mentioned that his father took over as preacher at St John the Baptist Church during the early years of the War thus allowing the minister to enlist. In 1930 Charles took over his cousin "Dick" Russell's 2,200 acre property known as *Narrabundah*. During Post World War period Charles bought ten small wooden cubicle huts with iron roofs from Molonglo and put up two on Red Hill for his shepherd and the other eight on his lease at Woden where they were occupied by three families - two Latvian, one Yugoslav and one single English Migrant who worked at Mugga Quarry. Charles goes on to say that he never charged any rent for these cubicles and the occupancy changed a few times. The cubicles were destroyed in the bushfire of 1952.

Charles died in the late 1990s.

Charles Croft Russell of 51 Endeavour Street Red Hill paid for the grave in the Anglican section of Woden Cemetery for Kathleen Russell of the same address who died on 25<sup>th</sup> February 1966 aged 58 years. Charles Croft Russell died in the 1990s.

The writing is difficult to read. The person who purchased the grave in the RC section of the Woden Cemetery was L or N or V? Res of 42 McKinlay Street Narrabundah. The deceased had lived at 37 McKinlay Street Narrabundah and the 1967 Electoral Roll notes that Emilia Lunadello lives at the same address. Two entries further down the page refer to another purchase in the RC section of Woden Cemetery by the same person for Baby Frederico who was stillborn on 26<sup>th</sup> March 1963. The address for the baby was 42 Banfield Street Downer.

An article in *Canberra Historical Journal* No 24, September 1989 by Barry York entitled *The early Italians in Canberra 1924 to the 1950s* refers to a number of early Italian families in Canberra including Clem Forner. The article suggests that Pietro Varenna was probably the first Italian in Canberra. He arrived in 1924. However there were Italians in the FCT long before that. Glen Cappello's father Ermino arrived in the ACT in 1914 and worked on the Power House. He and his brother were naturalised

before the first electoral roll in 1928 in Canberra but did not go on to the roll. The Ghiradello family also arrived before 1924. However the article mentions quite a few of the early Italian families who came to Canberra.

Clem Forner came to Canberra via Griffith in the mid 1920s and lived for a time at Red Hill single men's camp. He worked for a time on the sewer pipe line. Clem was joined later by his brother Martin who helped him establish a wood merchant business. Clem was joined by his wife in 1931. She died in 1942 leaving him with three small children to raise. His sister in law, Maria took over the caring of the children.

Clemente Forner is buried in Woden Cemetery. His grave has the dates 12<sup>th</sup> December 1897 – 1<sup>st</sup> November 1985. Clemente Forner paid for the grave in the RC section of Woden Cemetery for Concetto Forner who died on 14<sup>th</sup> February 1942 aged 41 years.

10 FORNER, James ps James Peter Forner was born in Castelcuco Italy on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 1924. He died in Canberra on 12<sup>th</sup> November 1977 and was the husband of Helen and father of Beverley, Laurie and Peter. He is buried in Woden Cemetery.

*Solemn send-off for a tireless Canberra campaigner*

*A former Canberran of the year, Kath Bourke, received a solemn send-off from about 250 mourners yesterday, gathering in St Christopher's Cathedral for a Requiem Mass. Mrs Bourke, 81, died last week after a lifetime of fighting for women's and aged peoples' rights. She was named Canberran of the Year in 1989.*

*One of Mrs Bourke's four sons, Stephen, delivered a eulogy, speaking of his parents' long and happy marriage and of his mother's roles as mother, housewife and tireless campaigner. He said his brothers and sisters were often mystified by their mother's comings and goings in the evenings after finishing "the never-ending tasks that were needed to keep the household running smoothly".*

*He believed her dedication to women's rights began when she was forced out of her public service job as a stenographer in 1943 when she married Harry Bourke. Married women were barred from Public Service employment at the time. Mrs Bourke spent the next 23 years campaigning against that rule, succeeding in 1966.*

*Stephen also listed his mother's many voluntary community services and ministerial appointments, including membership of the National Women's Consultative Council and as foundation president of the Canberra Senior Citizens' Centre.*

*The mass was conducted by Bishop Pat Power, who recalled Mrs Bourke's strong presence and invaluable contributions to Canberra's Catholic community. He said Mrs Bourke's full and active life had embodied the sense of*

*hope central to the Pope's message for 2002. Mrs Bourke is survived by her seven children: Darryl, Sharon, Carmel, Stephen, Gavin, Maureen and Michael. She was buried at Gungahlin cemetery.*
