HMAS HARMAN 1943-1993 A HISTORY OF HMAS HARMAN by Lieutenant Annette Nelson RAN and friends.

BOXHALL, Loran & Glanville hd & petty officer. Annette Nelson & friends had the following to say about the beginnings of Harman and Commander Boxall (note spelling): *At the end of the immediate post war period the Naval Board realised that the HARMAN STATION would need upgrading. In 1949 Commander Boxall who had been OIC Belconnen since 1945 as an electrical officer (but who originally had been a communicator) was sent to the UK and the US to study the latest developments in shore radio. On his return to Australia he submitted technical specifications for the 'new' Harman to the Director of Naval Communications (DNC), and then remained as project engineer until 1958...*

HARMAN NAVAL STATION

Lieutenant Annette Nelson and friends:

THE BEGINNINGS...1928-1939

In 1924 the Communications Sub-Committee of the Imperial Defence Committee recommended the modernization of the coastal radio stations at Perth, Darwin, Townsville and Rabaul in order to provide suitable naval facilities in the Pacific. The following year the Australian Commonwealth Naval Board (ACNB) then recommended the establishment of strategic wireless stations at Canberra and Darwin. Canberra was chosen because of the need for security and the communications service particularly in relation to the likelihood of enemy attack. 'Seventy five miles from the coast satisfied the requirements, taking into consideration possible air raids launched from enemy aircraft in the Pacific or direct from direct from overseas territories.' In January 1935 a Minister for Defence Minute stated that: 'The medium high powered station at Canberra is stated to be necessary for the defence of Empire interests in the Pacific so that it carry out the

duties of Rugby (UK) station on the Australian Naval Station area and the major part of the Western Pacific. It would also cover certain areas in high frequency transmissions at present skipped by the transmitters at Rugby. It also stated that the Canberra Station in conjunction with Rugby should make it possible to communicate with British Merchant of Fleet shipping in any part of the world...

In 1937 the Commonwealth Government decided to erect receiving and transmitting stations in Canberra, and on 1st October the Director of Signals together with the representatives from the Department of the Interior and the Amalgamated Wireless (Australasia Ltd visited the various possible sites. For the transmitting station a site was selected in the vicinity of Ginninderra Creek in the Belconnen district; and for the receiving station the most suitable site was on the top of Red Hill, southeastward of the reservoir. The AWA were then requested to test the suitability of the sites; and on 6th September 1938 approval was given to proceed at Belconnen and the present site of Harman. Standard Telephones Ltd started construction at Belconnen in November and at Harman early in 1939 with the first transmission being made on 22 December of that year... The article continues with the information that on Saturday 17th April 1939 the first batch of 30 naval officers and rating to 9 operate and guard the powerful short wave naval wireless station in the British Empire and the largest or commercial station in the southern hemisphere. The Post Master General's (PMG) Department was advised on 20th July the names of Belconnen Transmitting Station Harman Receiving Station had been allocated...

A Recreation Hall at Harman opened 27th July 1941 and a general mess in late 1940 or early 41 and a second general mess was built in 1943.

The history also mentions the use of the old Molonglo School – situated in what is now Tennant St Fyshwick. It was used as an auxiliary Wireless Station and remained operational until 1946. Marion Stevens was in charge of Molonglo from 1943-1945. The building was later used as a dog

training school until the 1980 when it was pulled down.
