He came to Westlake from Newcastle where the farm that he owned was resumed for a new suburb of Newcastle. Eliza Emma Pennington nee Brown born 1880 Waterloo NSW left No 40 sometime after 1949. She moved with Herbert James (Bert) her eldest son to Flat 1 of 36 Batman Street Braddon. Eliza married on the 9th May 1961 and is buried together with her husband Thomas at Woden Cemetery in section C Presbyterian grave 074. Herbert (Bert as he was known) was born in 1916 at Toowoomba Qld. He later married Kathleen French. Bert died 27th September 1994. Douglas Baker Pennington born Toowoomba Qld 28th June 1918 while living at Westlake married Emily Betty Portingale born South Melbourne Vic 15th July 1924. Jadwyga Lezkiewicz of 29 Westlake who died March 1953 aged one year. The grave was paid by Wladis Lezkiewicz. The family later moved to 34 Westlake which was one of the two cottages not moved to new sites following the departure of the tenants. The other was 29 Westlake – both suffered from fires.

The Smijewski family moved into 59 Westlake to share with the Robinson family. They were the first New Australians to move into Westlake after the war. Later the family moved to 9 Musgrave St Yarralumla where Nina Smijewsky died 22 September 1954 aged 47. In the grave next to her is her husband, Juchim. Her son, Alex (Shore) died on 31 December 1999.

Another death of a Westlake family member was that of Baby Bishop stillborn 12 October 1947. Kevin John Bishop paid for the grave in the Anglican section of Woden Cemetery.
