

## INTRODUCTION – CORRECTIONS

### CAMPS 2009

In early 2000 I began this work of compiling, updating information that I had collected over the previous decade. By using the computer - the electronic media and saving information on CDs I was able to add far more photographs than I would have been able to do if confined to the the more limiting printed media.

However, as is the way of things – new information has come to light since this work was completed in 2004. In particular, the site of No 1 Labourers Camp – it is on Capital Hill, which was a part of Westlake in the 1920s. The site which I believed to be No 1 was the site of the shortlived May 1927 camp established for the men of the police force and other services taking part in the opening ceremonies on 9<sup>th</sup> May 1927. The updated information is now published in *A STORY OF CAPITAL HILL* Gugler 2009.

I do not intend to rewrite all the information in the files, but draw the reader's attention to a mistake that I have made. The Tradesmen's Camp, Westlake was established on the hill opposite Lotus Bay in 1924 not 1923 and No 1 Labourers Camp was established on Capitol Hill (spelt then with and 'o' not 'a'), Westlake in 1923 not 1924. At some time in the future I will go through all the files to correct this error and update information.
